The <u>Radio Control Club of Detroit</u> invites you to experience model aviation at our 2nd annual Introduction to Radio Control Aircraft 101.

Types of models to be shown * Scale; Large scale; Aerobatics; Aircraft powered only by electric propulsion; Aircraft powered only by 4-stroke engines; Aircraft that have either two or more wings or two or more engines; Combat planes that target 30-foot streamers towed behind opponents' aircraft, while defending their own streamers.

Registered participants will have an opportunity to experience R/C flying. After we describe the basic principles of R/C flight, you'll fly on the "Buddy System" - two transmitters connected by a cable. A club Intro Pilot will fly one of our R/C model aircraft to a safe altitude, controlling it with the primary transmitter. Then he will depress a switch on that transmitter to permit control by the secondary transmitter in your hands. You get to fly the plane. But don't worry; if you get the plane into trouble, he can regain control at any time by releasing the switch on his transmitter.
